SEMINAR ON CO-OP HOUSING SOCIETY

On 15th May ,the traditional diyas were lighted to herald the beginning of the seminar on Co-op Housing Society at Sarvodaya Hall, Jain Compound, Opposite Diamond Talkies, LT Road, Borivli (W).

The convenor of the Seminar PP Chetan shortly described the purpose of the seminar. The format of the seminar was that each speaker would speak for 20-25 minutes and after all three speakers had finished their talk the written questions received from the floor would be answered by the speakers.

President Ashok informed the gathering about Rotary International and projects of Rotary Club of Borivli, with the help of a power-point presentation.
